The college has effective mechanism to conduct examinations smoothly. The examination committee makes the annual plan and conducts it effectively. The college and university examinations are conducted strictly in the college. All the teaching staff performs their examination duties like junior and senior supervision and assessment work neatly. The preliminary examinations are conducted in the college to give the students more practice. The evaluation of the examination is made as per the norms of the university. Tests, Tutorials, group discussions, seminars, one day workshops etc. are conducted in the college which helps to evaluate the performance of the students.

#### **6.3.4 Research and Development**

The research committee promotes the teaching faculty and the students to participate in research activities. The teachers are motivated to apply and complete minor and major research projects of the BCUD and UGC. The research grants received from BCUD and UGC are allocated to the teachers as per the norms. Infilibnet facility is provided by the library for the teachers and students who are interested in research. ARC promotes the teaching faculty to participate in research activities. Every year the students are encouraged to participate in *Avishkar* organized by BCUD of Savitribai Phule Pune university.

#### **6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation**

The library uses Infilibnet software which provides e-journals and e-books as reference material to the students and teaching staff. The Bar coding system is used for all the books. The college has a well equipped digital language lab and commerce lab which provides internet facility to the learners. The language lab software ODLL is used to enhance knowledge of the language learners. All the departments have been provided computer and internet facility. The office staff is also provided internet facility and College Management System software which helps to keep the office data intact. The library has kept the books on Spoken English and Competitive Examination separately. The college has its vehicle parking shed, gymnasium, hostel, commerce lab, science lab, BCA lab, English language lab, canteen, library and generator backup facility.

#### **6.3.6 Human Resource Management**

The students are the main and basic human resource for the college. The college tries its level best for the complete personality development of the students. Various activities of NCC, NSS, Students Welfare are implemented effectively. All the departments take special efforts for the development of the students. Cultural activities and sports activities in the college initiate the students' participation in various programmes. The soft skill development programme and competitive examination departments in the college take special efforts for the students. Departmental meetings, staff and non-teaching staff meeting, IQAC meetings, Alumni meets and Parents meets are conducted in the college.

#### **6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment**

The LMC committee's recommendations are taken into consideration regarding the recruitment of the faculty and staff. The recruitment of the staff is done strictly by following the rules and regulations laid down by the government, university and U.G.C. The temporary teaching and non-teaching staff for non-grant or professional or add-on courses is recruited for one year, at the institutional level.

### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The college interacts with different GO's and NGO's and conduct various activities for the students. The possible attempts are made by the college by inviting nearby industries for providing job opportunities for the students.

### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

The college prospectus gives complete information regarding admission procedure. The college has a separate admission committee to finalise admissions. The reservation policies are strictly followed in the admission process. The merit of the students is also considered which admitting the students in the respective classes.

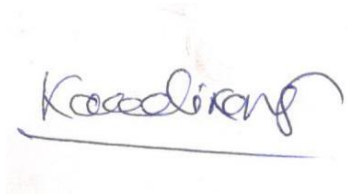

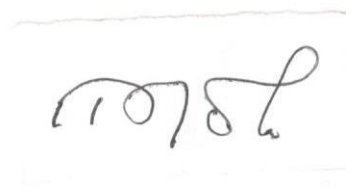

# Best Practice-I

## 1. Title of the Practice: Snake: Awareness Programme

## 2. Goals:

- To create awareness about snakes in the society
- To know different types of snakes found in our vicinity
- To understand snake by its sign of bite
- To learn about primary treatment to be given to the snake bite patient
- To identify symptoms and emergency treatment for snake bite
- To eradicate superstitions of people regarding snake bite and its treatment

## 3. The Context:

Snake is a very commonly found reptile in our vicinity. Snake bite is very common and all the rural hospital in Ambegaon tehsil provide anti-snake venom to the snake bite patients. Despite of it, many tribal villagers believe in mantras and take the patient in the temples like *khandoba* considering that the patient will be cured. Unfortunately many patients die if they don't get medical treatment quickly. In such situation it is need for the college to provide scientific information to the students for saving the patients in future.

## 4. Practice:

The college has taken the help of *sarpmitra* and medical practitioners to know the types of snakes. The attempts are made to create snake awareness among the students .The different types of snakes are shown to the students with the help of *sarpmitra* even the *serpmitra* has shown some techniques of how to hold the snakes .Some venomous and non venomous snakes are shown to the students found in this vicinity. The procedure of primary medical help is given to the students. Mr.Dhananjay Kokane and Dr.Theurkar discussed with students about so many issues regarding snakebite. Dr.Sadanand Raut who has started a hospital for snakebite patient guided the students and answers the questions of the students.Dr.Sadanand Raut's power point presentation on snakes and his research in this field has helped the students.

**5. Evidence of success:** The programme on snake awareness proved to be a great success as students come to know about snake bite symptoms and available medical facilities. Even this programme has helped the students to acknowledge that snake is not our enemy but friend of farmers .Moreover, students also come to know that existence of snake is necessary in the society.

**6. Problems encountered:** The *sarpmitra* Mr.Dhananjay kokane requested the students to come forward and touch the snake and try to get hold of it by controlling its body movements. On this occasion almost all the students were fearful. Even many students were not aware about the venomous and non venomous snakes found in this vicinity and availability of anti snake venom in all the rural hospitals.

**7. Resources required:** This snake awareness programme made the students and teachers aware that they need to take initiative by being a resource person for snake awareness programmes. The forest department ,*sarpmitra* and medical practitioners can prove to be the required resources.

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## Best Practice-2

### 1. Title of the Practice: Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan

### 2. Goals:

- To create awareness among girls
- To help the girl students in the college know the available facilities for them
- To understand the role of girls in the society
- To create awareness among the girl students about their fitness
- To remove the inferiority complex among the girls

### 3. The Context:

The college has got the sanction from Students Welfare Department of Savitribai Phule Pune University for conducting Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan. 130 girls participated in this activity out of which 5 girls from Dehne college and 5 girls from Manchar college participated in this activity. This abhiyan has helped the girl students who participated in it.

**4. Practice:** Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan was implemented on 04/01/2016. It was a full day activity. The programme was inaugurated in the presence of management members. Dr. Purushottam Kale, Mr. Santosh Shahane, Dr. Mrs. C.D. Jadhav and Mrs. Vaishali Savant guided the participants and made special attempts for the complete personality development of girls. Among the ladies teaching staff of the college Mrs. Autade, Ms. Salve, Ms. Borhade, Mrs. Temkar participated actively in this activity. This programme dealt with various issues such as personality development, employment opportunities, woman empowerment, health awareness and various other social issues related to woman empowerment. The last session of question-answer helped the girls to know the answers to their questions.

**5. Evidence of success:** All the participant girls were highly motivated due to this programme. The question-answer session was a grand success. It helped the girls to know the various opportunities for them.

**6. Problems encountered:** The participant girls were very shy to attend this programme. The college tried for the participation of the girls from various neighbouring colleges but only two colleges send the girls for attending the programme.
