


5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)





Criterion – VI <u>Governance, Leadership and Management</u>

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

Vision

To provide qualitative education for the youth through modern technology for their over-all development.

Mission

To uplift the backward, tribal and weaker section of Ambegaon taluka through higher education. To empower the illiterates and uneducated masses by educating them economical and cultural awareness.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System ?

Yes. The college has management information system and *Vriddh*i software which provide information.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college follows the syllabus prescribed by Savitribai Phule Pune university to which our college is affiliated .The college has no autonomy to develop or implement the curriculum. The college encourages the teaching staff to participate in the workshops and conferences based on curriculum framing/restructuring. The suggestions are given in such workshops/ conferences regarding framing/restructuring of the curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The special efforts are made to make the teaching and learning process more interesting, effective and useful. To enhance teacher's knowledge the teaching faculty is motivated and promoted to participate in various seminars, workshops and conferences. To enhance students' knowledge and performance various activities like group discussions, tests, tutorials, preliminary examinations, remedial couching, educational tours and orientations programmes are conducted. Quality improvement programme, special guidance scheme, guest lecturers' use of ICT and E- journals etc. facilities are provided for the students to make the teaching and learning process more transparent and effective. Feedback of the students and alumni is also recorded.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college has effective mechanism to conduct examinations smoothly. The examination committee makes the annual plan and conducts it effectively. The college and university examinations are conducted strictly in the college. All the teaching staff performs their examination duties like junior and senior supervision and assessment work neatly. The preliminary examinations are conducted in the college to give the students more practice. The evaluation of the examination is made as per the norms of the university. Tests, Tutorials, group discussions, seminars, one day workshops etc. are conducted in the college which helps to evaluate the performance of the students.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The research committee promotes the teaching faculty and the students to participate in research activities. The teachers are motivated to apply and complete minor and major research projects of the BCUD and UGC. The research grants received from BCUD and UGC are allocated to the teachers as per the norms. Inflibinet facility is provided by the library for the teachers and students who are interested in research. ARC promotes the teaching faculty to participate in research activities. Every year the students are encouraged to participate in *Avishkar* organized by BCUD of Savitribai Phule Pune University.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The library uses Inflibnet software which provides e-journals and e-books as reference material to the students and teaching staff. The Bar coding system is used for all the books. The college has a well equipped digital language lab and commerce lab which provides internet facility to the learners. The language lab software ODLL is used to enhance knowledge of the language learners. All the

departments have been provided computer and internet facility. The office staff is also provided internet facility and College Management System software which helps to keep the office data intact. The library has kept the books on Spoken English and Competitive Examination separately. The college has its vehicle parking shed, gymnasium, hostel, commerce lab, science lab, BCA lab, English language lab, canteen, library and generator backup facility.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The students are the main and basic human resource for the college. The college tries its level best for the complete personality development of the students. Varies activities of NCC, NSS, Students Welfare are implemented effectively. All the departments take special efforts for the development of the students. Cultural activities and sports activities in the college initiate the students' participation in various programmes. The soft skill development programme and competitive examination departments in the college take special efforts for the students. Departmental meetings, staff and non-teaching staff meeting, IQAC meetings, Alumni meets and Parents meets are conducted in the college.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The LMC committee's recommendations are taken into consideration regarding the recruitment of the faculty and staff. The recruitment of the staff is done strictly by following the rules and regulations laid down by the government, university and U.G.C. The temporary teaching and non-teaching staff for non-grant or professional or add-on courses is recruited for one year, at the institutional level.



Best Innovative Practice-1 (2016-2017)

Workshop on Legal Awareness

Goal: The aim of this activity is to make the students aware about their rights through legal awareness.

Context: The tribal students find many challenges before them as they belong to deprived classes of the society. The majority of the students in the college belong to tribal area, where they have to face many challenges. Through this activity the college has made the students aware about their rights in general and legal awareness in particular.

The Practice: Law has direct and indirect impact on every citizen of India. Youth are the future of country. They should know the laws which are essential at every sphere of life. B.D. Kale Mahavidyalaya, identified the need of it. Therefore, the college organised a'Workshop on Legal Awareness' in collaboration with NSS, and Ambegaon Taluka Bar Association. Hon. Patil, the judge of Ghodegaon Court was the chief guest of the inauguration function of the workshop. In his presidential speech he remarked, 'law is crucial in its nature. Student should acquire the basics of it'. He guided briefly about the process regarding 'will (testament)' and necessary documentation for it. He interacted with students and clarifies their doubts. Adv. Nilesh Shelke, talked about the importance of RTI Act and Prevention of Ragging Act as well. Further, he urged the students to avoid violation of these legal Acts in order to prevent dreadful effects on career. Adv. Deepak Gavade, also pointed out the issue of child criminals while discussing the topic – 'Rights of Citizen & Role of Police in society'. He provided the information about child criminals, their nature and punishment.

Evidence of Success: The workshop proved to be beneficial for all students and staff as well. Hon. Sanjay Aarwikar, Chairman of New English School Committee, Adv. Madhukar Suryawanshi (Adviser), Adv. Anil Pokharkar, and . Adv. Mukundrao Walase were present for the workshop.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: We were expecting different questions from the students which they faced in their day-today-life, but very few students asked questions to the resource persons.

Best Innovative Practice-2 (2016-2017)

Voter's Registration Programme

Goal: The aim of this activity is to make the students aware about their voting right and help them to get enrolled as the voter by arranging voter's registration programme.

Context: Many students are not conscious and aware about the voter's enrolment Programme. The College has made the attempt to create consciousness and awareness among the students by arranging voter's registration camp in the college. The college also has done the crucial role by enrolling the students as voters.

The Practice: The students who have completed 18 years are eligible for voting. Young students are inseparable part of every college. Therefore, B.D.Kale Mahavidyalaya took an initiative and organised Voters Awareness programme. The department of Political Science filled up form no 6 and registered 126 students successfully. National Scheme Service department also organised a street play based on Voter's Awareness, at different places of Ghodegaon such as Chawdi, Maharani Chowk, poarch of New India Hotel, Bus stop, Janata High School, B.D. Kale College campus etc.

Evidence of Success:

Street Play is one of the influential medium to reach the people easily and spreads message effectively. 8 volunteers performed Street Play at different places and voiced for voter's voting right.
